Dear Friends.

Donors to United Way of the Southern Tier provided nearly \$3 million in support to local non-profit programs in 2023-2024.

More than 6,000 caring people in Chemung and Steuben counties, including individuals, employees of area businesses, and corporate partners, gave generously to United Way of the Southern Tier to support services for children, senior citizens, and struggling individuals and families.

United Way provided \$2,764,911 to 67 programs. An additional \$191,212 from the Senior Supports Fund (Page 6) was awarded to local organizations that serve senior citizens in Chemung and Steuben counties. United Way remains committed to doing more for this vulnerable population.

Besides providing monetary and program assistance to local nonprofits, United Way organized its largest-ever Day of Action in 2024. Nearly 400 individuals fanned out across the region at 32 projects, providing 2,300 volunteer hours on a single day.

Throughout the year, United Way also engaged the community in drives to collect items for local programs including: diapers for families of young children, notes of encouragement and toiletries for school-age children, and stocking stuffers for senior citizens.

We are pleased to offer this 2023-2024 Annual Report and invite you to review the results of your investments.

Thank you for making the Southern Tier a strong and thriving community.



# DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY



United Way of the Southern Tier's local chapter of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library continues to grow, with more than half of all children under age 5 in Chemung and Steuben counties enrolled and receiving a free book by mail each month.

In early 2024, United Way partnered with Pro Action of Steuben & Yates, Inc., to bring the Imagination Library to the young children of Yates County.

United Way of the Southern Tier is grateful to the individuals, groups, businesses, municipalities, and foundations that continue to provide financial support for the Imagination Library, promoting early literacy efforts in our community. More than 10,000 local children have been touched by the Imagination Library since United Way of the Southern Tier began the program in 2018.

United Way of the Southern Tier awarded \$191,212 in Senior Supports Fund grants in 2024 to further assist the senior population who wish to age in place where they are comfortable and happy, fostering both independence and enhanced social connections within their community. The fund was created in 2021 through an anonymous bequest of nearly \$1 million to United Way of the Southern Tier. Grants are awarded in addition to annual allocations made by United Way through donations to the Community Campaign. A total of \$548,212 in Senior Supports Fund grants has been awarded since 2022 to address the needs of this growing vulnerable population.

## 2024 GRANTS

- **Arbor Housing and Development:** \$20,000 for home repairs for the elderly.
- Bampa's House: \$8,100 for exterior building repairs.
- Chemung County Department of Aging: \$20,000 for a pilot program to alleviate unsafe and unsanitary living conditions and address code violations.
- Chemung County Habitat for Humanity: \$12,000 to build handicap-accessible ramps.
- Corning Meals on Wheels: \$18,260 to purchase microwavable containers and a scheduling tool.
- **Eagle Transmission:** \$4,001 for repair of a handicapped ramp-equipped van.
- Family Services of Chemung County: \$5,400 for personal care aide tuition and office equipment.
- Home & Health Care Services: \$10,000 for a new clinical information module computer program.

- Hornell Area Family YMCA: \$5,000 for a senior "Lunch and Learn" program.
- Meals on Wheels of Chemung County: \$6,445 to purchase a reach-in freezer.
- **Pro Action Meals on Wheels:** \$14,000 to purchase a commercial dishwasher and refrigerator.
- Neighborhood Transformation Center: \$17,500 for a "Grandparents Raising Grandchildren" program and for safety repairs to the building entrance (2 projects).
- The Senior Center/Chemung County Family Fitness Center: \$10,000 to purchase exercise equipment.
- Steuben County Office for the Aging: \$15,506 for the Senior Companion Program.
- Steuben Senior Services Fund: \$25,000 to enroll more seniors in Full Circle America home monitoring program.

# TOUR DE KEUKA BIKE RIDE RAISES \$85,000



United Way of the Southern Tier's Tour de Keuka charity bike ride attracted 209 riders on August 3, 2023, and raised \$85,000 for local programs through rider fundraising and sponsorships.

Each year bicyclists select a distance (45, 60 or 100miles, or virtual), pay a registration fee, and commit to fundraise at least \$150 for United Way of the Southern Tier. Nearly 80 volunteers keep track of riders on the course, operate rest stops, and provide meals, drinks and support to the participants.

Registration is now open for United Way of the Southern Tier's 2025 Tour de Keuka, which will take place on Saturday, August 2. Tour de Keuka began in 2005 as a fundraiser for the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation. United Way has organized the ride since 2021. More information: **tourdekeuka.org**.
